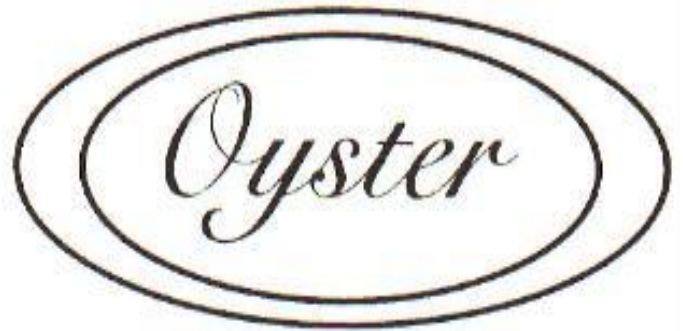

FFF / SEC EDUCATIONAL RODS & REELS and FLY-TYING KITS

The South Eastern Council has Fly-CASTING Outfits (20 6-weight and 10 8-weight) and 20 Fly-TYING Toolkits and Materials for use by member clubs for fly-casting classes, seminars, fly-tying classes, etc.

The use of this equipment costs the clubs only shipping back to me. We ship them to you by Fedex Ground 5-Day service. How you get them back to us doesn't matter as long as they are available for the next user in time for their classes. This process requires advanced notice. I need you to email or phone me your requested dates and other information (club name, address to ship them to, etc). **I would ask that you do that several weeks if not months in advance of your fly-casting or fly-tying session.** That way I can plan on how to get the equipment to you in time for your classes.

FRED STEVENSON SCHOLARSHIP FUND

With the economy being what it is today and many Federation members being of the age to have children in college, I thought it appropriate to remind folks about the SEC's FRED STEVENSON SCHOLARSHIP FUND. This \$1,000.00 grant is awarded each year to an under-graduate or post-graduate student who makes application to and is accepted by our scholarship review committee. In past years it has actually been a chore to try to solicit applications for the scholarship ... folks just weren't aware that we have this wonderful benefit. So, stated below are the criteria for applying for this award.

The CRITERIA for the SEC's grant are: The applicant must:

- Be students registered at a fully accredited public college or university within the FFF South Eastern Council geographical region (AL, FL, GA, KY, LA (east of the Mississippi River), MS, NC, SC or TN) and must be in at least their sophomore year of college.
- Be majoring in a field of study that fosters the preservation of and/or protection of gamefish or their habitats; for instance, a field relating to aquatic or wetland ecology might qualify as well as more obvious curricula dealing with fish biology, restoration ecology, fisheries management, etc.
- Have a 3.0 (of a possible 4.0) G.P.A. or better.
- Send a certified copy of his/her transcript plus a statement (at least one page long) explaining how the award monies will further the recipient's career goals to the Scholarship Awards Committee.

Notes:

- As of the 2003 FFF/SEC board meeting, applications can come from both undergraduate and graduate students.
- As of the 2004 FFF/SEC board meeting there is no FFF membership requirement; applicants who are either themselves an FFF member or who have an immediate parent or guardian who is an FFF member will be given preferential status over non-members.
- What constitutes an appropriate field of study is left largely to the scholarship committee to decide, but a broad concept will possibly enlarge the potential pool of applicants.

FLY FISHING SHOW & CONCLAVE FLY-TYERS

Mike Arnold, Burlington, KY - Mike Arnold has been hanging around the South Eastern Council since it started in 1991 ... but no one has ever seen him tie a fly. So after thirty years of flyfishing just for fun, teaching fly-casting, fly-tying, rod-building and bent-wood net-frame building, he's finally decided to prove he's not "all show and no go". Mike will be making some fly-fishing muskie "lures" (they're too big to rightfully be called flies even though he does throw them with a 9-weight).

John Berry, Cotter, AK - John has been a fly fishing guide for the past 15 years and guides on Arkansas's White, Norfork, Spring, and Little Red Rivers for trout and Crooked Creek for Smallmouth Bass. He is the past president of the Mid South Fly Fishers and served as the Conservation Director for the Southern Council of the Federation of Fly Fishers. He is a life member of the Federation of Fly Fishers and the Mid South Fly Fishers and a member of the North Arkansas Fly Fishers and other organizations.

Max Birnkammer, Smyrna, GA - Max started tying flies seven years ago. He ties mostly warm water flies, which he uses to catch largemouth, spotted and shoal bass in the rivers and lakes close to home in Smyrna. He has tied at fly fishing shows and has led seminars at local fly shops. His favorite bass flies are hand painted poppers and streamers. He builds his own fly rods and can often be seen fishing from one of his vintage wooden boats.

Bob Clemenson, Dunwoody, GA - Bob has been tying for over forty years. He ties flies for trout fishing in north Georgia. He has tied at the South Eastern Conclave, Southern Conclave, Gulf Coast Conclave and two national conclaves. Bob is also one of the great story-tellers of all time.

Oscar Feliu, The Villages, FL - Oscar is a native of Chile, and came to the USA in 1969. Oscar has been doing tying demonstrations and workshops for FFF for over 30 years. His fly tying has taken him throughout North America and Europe. His fly patterns have been the center of many Magazine articles and books on the subject. In 1989 he relocated from Michigan to Florida where he has designed several very successful Saltwater flies to add to his monster collection of trout fly designs.

Dana Griffin III, Gainesville, FL - Dana has been interested in fly tying and fly fishing since 1947 when he caught a small trout on the West Fork of the San Juan River in southwest Colorado. The 8-inch rainbow fell to a Rio Grande King. Dana's interest seems to have matured into something resembling a love affair, a condition for which there apparently is no cure. Dana has originated many new fly patterns and authored numerous articles on fly tying and fly fishing in regional and national journals.

Anthony Hipps, Lexington, NC - Anthony served as the FFF-SEC Conclave Fly Tying Co-Chair and is on the FFF- Southeastern Council Board of Directors. Anthony enjoys publicly sharing his fly-tying techniques and writing about fly-tying. He has served as president, vice president, program chairman and Board member of the Nat Greene Fly Fishers in Greensboro, NC. Anthony has been nationally recognized for many fly patterns but most especially for his unique soft-bodied foam flies.

Walt Holman, Madison, AL - Walt has been a fly-rodder, bug and fly designer, constructor, tyer and user for over 50 years. A long-time member of the FFF and the Tennessee Valley Fly Fishers, he has tied at conclaves and various clubs of the Southern and Southeastern councils. He has also tied at the FFF international shows in Livingston, MT and Gatlinburg, TN. Walt's foil covered pencil poppers are a major attraction every year at the FFF-SEC Conclave. Walt is a retired electrical engineer.

Matthew Inman, Valdosta, GA - Matthew began tying while at the University of Georgia in order to supply the trees and fish of North Georgia with acceptable offerings. After moving back to south Georgia upon graduation his fishing and fly-tying shifted toward the local warm-water quarry and nearby saltwater game. He has recently become bitten by the full-dress salmon fly and has benefited greatly from the guidance of other fly-tyers. Matthew lives in Valdosta, GA with his wife Andrea, daughter Bailee and son Drew.

Dave Kline, Atlanta, GA - Dave has been tying flies for 25 years. He is a founder and past president of the Flatland Fly Fishers. He got started in Pennsylvania tying traditional Catskill trout flies. A company transfer to Kansas gave him the opportunity to tie and fish many styles of warm water flies for everything from carp to catfish. Dave has been tying full dress salmon flies since the 90s. Today he likes to tie and fish traditional patterns for bass and trout. Spey flies are particular favorites.

Tom Logan, Tallahassee, FL - is a certified wildlife biologist from Tallahassee, Florida who makes a living as a private environmental consultant. He enjoys tying classic trout patterns and fishing them for southern bream and bass in his home waters, as well as for trout in the Smoky Mountains, Sierras and other streams of the western United States. He also ties Atlantic salmon flies, but has a special interest in tying historic and modern soft-hackles and other wet patterns. Tom teaches fly tying classes.

Allen McGee, Alpharetta, GA - Allen McGee has been fly fishing and tying flies for trout for nearly 20 years. Allen has flyfished extensively throughout the eastern, mid-western, and Rocky Mountain western United States and even as far away as the mountains of South Korea. He enjoys pursuing big fish with light tackle particularly on difficult spring creek-type streams. He is a fly designer for the Montana Fly Company, an outdoor photographer, and author. He lives in Alpharetta, Georgia

Jack Neely, Summerfield, FL - Born in Menasha, Wisconsin in 1935, Jack grew up on an island and first tied at age of 6, sold his first fly at the local barbershop for 7 to 10 cents each and he put himself through Marquette University in part through tying flies. Jack has tied flies at Conclaves in the West Yellowstone from 1983-1987. He has taught fly tying in Wisconsin, Illinois, Texas, plus Philadelphia, Connecticut and Florida. He specializes in teaching beginners and intermediate levels of tyers.

Robert Prytula, Chattanooga, TN - Robert began tying flies in 1990. He has demonstrated fly tying at the Ducks Unlimited Outdoor Festival, Great Cotter Trout Festival, Sowbug Round-up, Southern Conclave, Houston Fly Tying Festival, Southeastern Conclave, and MSFF Home Waters Expo. He is a member of the Mid-South Fly Fishers and is currently President of the Appalachian Chapter of TU. A professor as a trade, Robert also is a guide, fly tyer and instructor for the local Orvis shop in Chattanooga.

Craig Riendeau, Cumming, GA - Craig is a member of the Atlanta Fly Fishing Club and the Fall Line Fly Anglers of Macon, Georgia. An ardent warm water fly tier and angler originally from the Chicagoland area where he was fly fishing director for the Illinois Smallmouth Alliance. He was a speaker and demonstrator at many Midwest fly shows. Now he plies his talents on the spots and shoals that inhabit Georgia's waters.

G.S. "Stack" Scoville, Nashville, TN - Stack's tying education started with books and limited material and tools. Trout flies, wets, dries, nymphs, and streamers eventually gave way to spinning deer hair and bass bugs. The inspiration of books like Poul Jorgensen's book on tying salmon flies and The Atlantic Salmon Fly, The Tyers and Their Art by Judith Dunham led to lots of research and his chapter contribution in Mike Radencich's "Tying the Classic Salmon Fly." Stack developed his own style for artistic flies.

Cassie Sulzby

Robert Taylor, Crystal River, FL - Robert has been tying for about 8 years. He started with trout flies and nymphs then did some 'realistic' bugs. For the past couple of years he has been tying Salmon classics, Carrie Stevens Streamers and wet flies. He has tied the complete 400+ Bergman series of wet flies in two sizes half of which he is going to mount as plates as shown in his book 'Trout'. Robert has also tied the complete set of Carrie Stevens streamers as listed in Hilyard's book and mounted them in frames.

Paul Tidroski, Port Richey, FL - A fisherman for over 50 years and fly fisherman and tyer for the last 12 years, Paul began tying classic mixed feather-wing salmon flies, Rangeley streamers made famous by Carrie Stevens and the classic wet flies of Ray Bergman. Paul's flies are currently on exhibit in the permanent collection of the Museum of Hunting and Fishing in Munich, Germany and the Margaree Salmon Fishing Museum in Cape Breton, Nova Scotia. Paul lives in New Port Richey, FL with his wife Lynne.

Tom Travis, Livingston, MT and Sebastian, FL - has been teaching fly tying for over 30 year and has taught seminars and performed fly tying demos at the SE FFF Conclave for a number of years. Tom has also tied at the British International Fly Fair, and countless other shows. Tom is a fly designer & contract tyer for the Orvis Company. Tom has also written for several of the fly fishing publications as well as doing a booklet for the National FFF. He splits his time between Montana and Florida homes.

Beth Tuttle, Lawrenceville, GA - You do not have to have years of experience to enjoy the different aspects of fly fishing and teach others. Beth did not seriously start fly fishing until she joined the Georgia Women Flyfishers in 1998, and she has been hooked ever since! She began tying flies as soon as she started fly fishing. As a teacher and mentor, Beth has taught "Beginner Fly Tying" all over the south-east. She fishes the streams around her home in Atlanta and North Georgia.

Rex Wilson, Candler, NC - has been tying flies for 30 years. He has tied at several FFF SEC (and other) conclaves. He ties the Smokey Mountain Fly patterns.
